- Section 2. That the District hereby selects \$2,500 as its Retrospective Allocation Point (RAP) for the Authority's cost allocation formula for Workers' Compensation.
- Section 3: That the Treasurer of this District is hereby authorized to pay to the ACWA/Joint Powers Insurance Authority its deposit premium quarterly.
- Section 4. That the Secretary of the Board of Directors of this District is directed to certify a copy of this resolution and to forward the same resolution, and the signed Joint Powers Agreement promptly by mail to the Association of California Water Agencies/ Joint Powers Insurance Authority, P.O. Box 619082, Roseville, California, 95661, at which time coverage will commence the 1st day of July 2023.

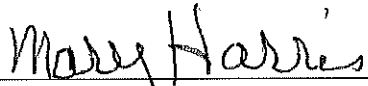

A RESOLUTION CLARIFYING THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMPONENT OF THE DISTRICT'S WATER SYSTEM CAPACITY FEE

WHEREAS, The District adopted Ordinance 2016-01 to revise the water system capacity fee in September 2016, and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to applicable statutes in California Government Code 66000 et seq., the revised capacity fee was established to be proportional to the cost through the District's adoption of the Water Capacity Fee Study by Bartle Wells, which provides for an administration costs, and

WHEREAS, The Capacity Fee Study combines the fee components of; Engineering, Construction Management and Administration into a singular, combined fee amount equal to 15% (fifteen percent) of the construction cost, and

WHEREAS, It is necessary and appropriate to segregate and clarify that the Administration component be separated from the combined , Engineering, Construction Management and Administration components, and

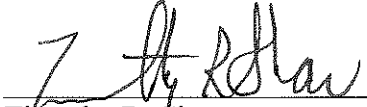
WHEREAS, The desired segregation and clarification will not modify the total Water Capacity Fee.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-06

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE RIO LINDA ELVERTA COMMUNITY WATER DISTRICT
ADOPTING A REPORT OF DELINQUENT UTILITY CHARGES
AND AUTHORIZING COLLECTION ON COUNTY TAX ROLL**

WHEREAS, the Rio Linda Elverta Community Water District ("District") levies and collects water and sewer service charges from District utility customers to pay for the operation, maintenance and related costs of District water and sewer systems and services; and

WHEREAS, District water and sewer service charges are calculated and levied based on the rate schedules adopted by the District Board and they are not levied based on the value of the customer's real property; and

WHEREAS, District water and sewer service charges have been adopted in compliance with applicable laws, including California Constitution article XIII D, section 6 and California Water Code Sections 31007, 31025 and 31101; and

WHEREAS, some District customers from time to time become delinquent in their payment of water service charges; and

WHEREAS, the General Manager has prepared the attached Written Report for Delinquent Water Service Charges for Fiscal Year 2022/2023 (the "Report"); and

WHEREAS, the District has decided that said delinquent and unpaid charges are to be included in the annual taxes next levied upon the property and shall constitute a lien on the property, pursuant to Water Code Sections 31701(e) and 31701.5; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Water Code Section 31701.6, the District is required to notify the holder of title to the property whenever delinquent and unpaid charges for water and other services or either which could become a lien on such property pursuant to Water Code Section 31701.5 remain delinquent and unpaid for 60 days, as specified in the Report; and

WHEREAS, the District Board of Directors has conducted a duly noticed public meeting concerning the Report and considered any comments or protests received at the public meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Rio Linda Elverta Community Water District as follows:

1. The Board hereby approves and adopts the Report attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. The Board hereby authorizes and directs that the delinquent utility charges listed in the Report be collected on the County of Sacramento property tax roll. The Board hereby requests the Auditor-Controller of the County of Sacramento to enter the delinquent charge amounts against the respective parcels of land as they appear on the property tax roll and collect the delinquent amounts at the same time and in the same manner as general property taxes, pursuant to Water Code Section 31701.5.
2. The Board hereby directs the General Manager or his or her designee to provide the required notice to customers that delinquent utility charges will be collected on the County of Sacramento property tax roll, to submit all necessary documentation as required by the Auditor-Controller of the County of Sacramento, and to undertake all actions necessary and incidental in accordance with the California Water Code to collect the delinquent utility charges (as specified in **Exhibit A**) on the County of Sacramento property tax roll.

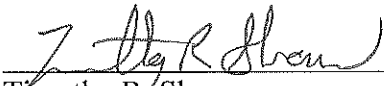

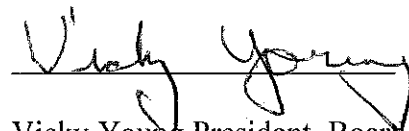

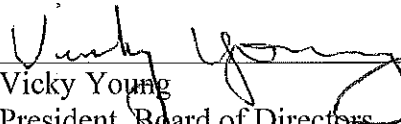

Use of water from District hydrants as provided under §4.21.140 of the Water System Regulations shall be in accordance with the following fees and charges:

Hydrant Use Fees	
Hydrant Permit Fee.....	\$100.00
Hydrant Meter Monthly Use	\$40.00 per month with a one (1) month minimum
Hydrant Water Use Charge.....	Current Volumetric Rate for Commercial Irrigation
Hydrant Meter Refundable Deposit.....	Current Cost to Replace Meter
Unauthorized Hydrant Use.....	\$200.00 per day, plus estimated water use charge

The fee provisions of §4.07.320 of the Water System Regulations are hereby repealed and superseded.

The General Manager may waive the use of a hydrant meter upon hydrant permit application if it is determined that the use of water is estimated to be less than 1000 cubic feet and the time period for use does not extend beyond fourteen (14) days. A District hydrant meter is also not required for governmental agencies billed on an annual, or other periodic, basis as approved by the General Manager. The General Manager may also waive the Hydrant Meter Deposit for nonprofit and governmental organizations using the meter for a period of less than five (5) days. Any organization receiving a deposit waiver shall sign a statement indicating that they will pay for the repair or replacement of any damaged or lost meters. All other charges shall be applicable.
